

Date: 2016-12-12 Subject: Ethics

Teacher: Irma Zukienė

Topic: "Safety on the Internet"

Lesson aims.

 To get acquainted with the dangers underlying the Internet, and ways to prevent them; to teach respectful behavior in the online space; to analyze different educational situations about safe online behavior.

Teaching methods.

 Demonstration, observation, creative work, group work, discussions, brainstorming, presentation, interview techniques.

Description of activities.

- To start the lesson students find out the meanings of the key words (Internet, law, safety, danger) and discuss
 about them.
- Students visit website "Draugiškas internetas" (<u>www.draugiskasinternetas.lt</u>) where they do questionnaire. They do it personally and find out how much they know about safety online.
- 3. Discussion on the results of the questionnaire.
- The analyses of the educational situations. Students watch short videos and after discuss them in groups.
- Reflection of the lesson. Students fill in reflection sheets.


