The important role of Parents

❖ **WHAT TO DO IN CASE OF ATTACK?**

We should ignore the offender and never try to answer the attack. The attacker has the purpose of causing negative reactions, so you must counteract this objective, not communicating with the same;

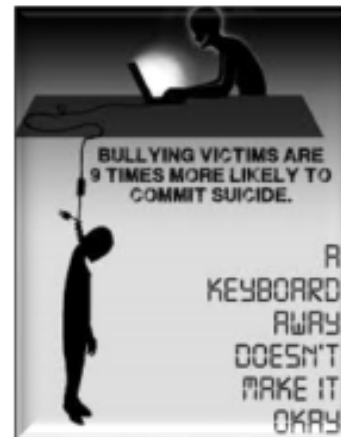
❖ **We must keep records of attacks that were made, along with the date and time that happened to serve as proof in case the attacker try to eliminate the trail of their actions;**

❖ **You can change your username/email account, if you simply do not want to be bothered. However if you do, we have to be careful to keep it private;**

❖ **You must not be condescending to this kind of attacks, even if you're not you the victim;**

❖ **Should the behavior seems to be responsible for online services where these practices and/or seek advice from the safer Internet Centre;**

❖ **In extreme cases, you must resort to justice. Cyberbullying is a crime, along with slander, libel, threaten and apologia and criminal acts. If the situation is out of control, you must inform the authorities.**
